CHAPTER 848
Sale of Farm Produce

848.01 STORAGE OR SALE SETBACK FROM STREET.

No personal property, farm products or farm produce shall be stored for sale, offered for sale or sold nearer than twenty-five feet from the improved portion of any street or public highway in the City. (Ord. 331. Passed 4-9-52.)

848.02 TABLE, BENCH OR BUILDING SETBACK.

No table, bench, building or structure may be used or contemplated to be used to offer for sale or to sell personal property, farm products or farm produce on any street or public highway in the City, unless the same is set back twenty-five feet or more from the improved portion of the street or public highway. (Ord. 331. Passed 4-9-52.)

848.03 CORNICE OR OVERHANG RESTRICTION.

If any building or other structure is constructed or used to offer for sale or to sell personal property, farm products and farm produce in the City, and has attached to it a cornice or portion of the building extending towards the improved portion of the street or highway, such cornice or overhanging portion of the building shall not extend more than four feet from the main portion of the building. This section is intended to cover the roof, cornice or any portion of the building hanging away from the main structure or building. (Ord. 331. Passed 4-9-52.)

848.04 PARKING FACILITIES REQUIRED; SETBACK.

Anyone who offers to sell or sells personal property, farm products or farm produce under this chapter in the City shall provide parking facilities for the use of customers and prospective customers. The parking facilities so provided shall be not nearer to the improved portion of the street or highway than twenty-five feet. (Ord. 331. Passed 4-9-52.)

848.99 PENALTY; EQUITABLE REMEDIES.

(a) Whoever violates or fails to comply with any of the provisions of this chapter is guilty of a minor misdemeanor and shall be fined not more than one hundred dollars (\$100.00) for each offense. A separate offense shall be deemed committed each day during or on which a violation or noncompliance occurs or continues.

(b) In addition to the penalty set forth in subsection (a) hereof, the City may institute legal or equitable proceedings that may be appropriate or necessary for the enforcement of legislation of the City and laws of the State regulating the sale of farm products and produce and other personal property. (Ord. 261-66. Passed 3-9-66.)
