

RESOLUTION NO. R-13-21

**A RESOLUTION REQUESTING THAT THE COUNTY AUDITOR,
PURSUANT TO OHIO REVISED CODE §5705.03(B)(1), CERTIFY TO THE
CITY OF AVON THE TOTAL CURRENT TAX VALUATION OF THE CITY AND THE
DOLLAR AMOUNT OF REVENUE THAT WOULD BE GENERATED BY A
ONE-HALF (.50) MILL RENEWAL LEVY FOR THE AVON POLICE DEPARTMENT
AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY**

WHEREAS, a One-Half (.50) mills Police Renewal Levy, pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 5705.19(J), was passed by the voters on November 8, 2016, and expires in duplicate year 2021, the last collection year being 2022; and

WHEREAS, in order to continue to keep the Police Department properly equipped, a one-half (.50) mill renewal levy is needed to be placed on the November 2, 2021 ballot to maintain motor vehicles, communications equipment, buildings and other infrastructure used directly in the operation of said Police Department; and

WHEREAS, said levy would be for a period of five (5) years beginning in the duplicate year 2022, with the first collection being 2023; and

WHEREAS, Council deems it to be in the best interests of the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of Avon to request the County Auditor certify to the City the total current tax valuation of the City and the dollar amount of revenue that would be generated by such a levy prior to submitting same to the voters.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AVON, COUNTY OF LORAIN AND STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1 – That before authorizing a levy in excess of the Ten Mill limit for the November 2, 2021 general election, the County Auditor shall certify to the City of Avon the total current tax valuation of the City and the dollar amount of revenue that would be generated by a one-half (.50) mill Police Renewal Levy authorized by ORC §5705.19(J) for a period of five (5) years beginning in duplicate year 2022, with the first collection being in 2023.

Section 2 – That the Clerk of Council is hereby directed to certify a copy of this Resolution to the Auditor of Lorain County, Ohio.

Section 3 – That it is found and determined that all formal actions of the Council of the City of Avon concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were taken in an open meeting of the Council of the City of Avon and that all deliberations of this City's Council and any of its committees that resulted in those formal actions were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Section 4 – That this Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure immediately necessary for the preservation of the public health, safety and welfare of the citizens of the City of Avon, the immediate emergency being the necessity for the County Auditor to certify

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to the City of Avon the total current tax valuation of the City and the dollar amount of revenue that would be generated by a five (5) year, one-half (.50) mill Police Renewal Levy in time to place said levy on the November ballot; therefore, this Resolution shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor.
