

ORDINANCE NO. 79-21

**AN ORDINANCE TO ESTABLISH A RANGE OF COMPENSATION FOR
THE POSITION OF PART-TIME, UNCLASSIFIED ZONING
ENFORCEMENT OFFICER FOR THE CITY OF AVON
AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY**

WHEREAS, the current Zoning Enforcement Officer for the City of Avon will be retiring in November of 2021; and

WHEREAS, compensation for said Zoning Enforcement Officer was based upon his years of service as a full-time employee; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to set compensation for this new part-time position at a level commensurate with experience and which is competitive with other municipalities so as to attract applicants with the desired qualifications and characteristics; and

WHEREAS, Council has recently reviewed the wage scale for all of the City's non-bargaining unit employees, full and part-time, and together with the recommendation of the Mayor, deems it to be in the best interests of the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of Avon that compensation for the newly created part-time Zoning Enforcement Officer position be established as set forth below.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AVON, LORAIN COUNTY, OHIO:

Section 1 - That effective upon appointment, the unclassified, part-time Zoning Enforcement Officer position shall be paid an hourly rate of between *Twenty-Five Dollars (\$25.00)* and *Thirty-Two Dollars (\$32.00)* per hour, together with all other benefits of a permanent, part-time, non-bargaining unit employee commencing with the date of hire.

Section 2 - The part-time Zoning Enforcement Officer shall be paid pursuant to the directives of the Finance Director. The Finance Director is authorized to adjust the annual appropriation to satisfy the additional wage and fringe benefits.

Section 3 - That it is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal actions were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Section 4 - That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare of the citizens of the City of Avon, the immediate emergency being the necessity to provide compensation for the unclassified position of part-time Zoning Enforcement Officer; therefore, this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor.
